**Warning Against Fake Social Media Accounts Impersonating  
AFP Senior Leaders**



**Overview**

Cyber threat actors have been creating fraudulent Facebook pages and other social media accounts using the names, photos, and ranks of AFP senior leaders. These fake accounts are being utilized to mislead the public, spread disinformation, and potentially conduct scams.

Such activities pose a risk not only to the reputation of the AFP but also to the safety and trust of the Filipino people.

It is strongly advised that AFP personnel to refrain from engaging with, following, or sharing content from unverified social media accounts claiming affiliation with AFP senior leaders. All official AFP updates, announcements, and communications are exclusively disseminated through the verified AFP and AFP Public Affairs Office channels.
